Article about Youth Conference in Camphill Newton Dee 2023

Community Building - How can we (re-)imagine our future? 11th -14th May 2023, Newton Dee

Background and Preparation

Youth Conferences have a well-established history in Camphill. Many long-standing co-workers share memories of Youth Conferences in the 70s. This awareness of each other and deep friendships between individuals and communities across the world are things that have taken place in Camphill over generations. And bringing this strength of the network of people surrounding the Camphill Movement to a new generation, was the intention behind rekindling the Youth Conference impulse.

The foundation to that was laid in 2018 (Clanabogan - "How can we carry the Camphill flame into the future?") and 2019 (Esk Valley - "How do we express our Camphill values in the modern world?"). Plans for conferences in 2020 (The Mount - "Living Camphill across Generations"), 2021 & 2022 (Newton Dee - "Community Building - Seeds for Social and Ecological Transformation") had to be cancelled unfortunately. An online Camphill Youth gathering in May 2021 took place instead.

The encouragement to keep going and not lose momentum, was given by three individuals from Newton Dee who one might call "of the older generation". They invited a small group of younger people within the Camphill Movement and the Youth Section to form an organising body. With the right mixture of wisdom sharing, guidance and letting go, these three facilitated a weekend in Newton Dee in November 2022 - passing on the baton and making it clear that they would not be involved in the further organising.

This weekend brainstorming around the questions of "What do we want to achieve?" & "Who do we want to reach?", marked the beginning of the planning phase. We explored common themes and interests of our generation today and recognised that there are a lot of young people in urban areas looking for a different way of life. Many are drawn towards community living but often don't know where to go or who to ask. Another common phenomenon we observed was that people who live in communities want to connect with others who share their values and way of life, to learn from and strengthen a wider awareness of each other and build networks of likeminded people and communities.

It was the start of a beautiful collaboration between individuals from Camphill Communities in Scotland, England, Northern Ireland and the US (Newton Dee, Esk Valley, Glencraig, Clanabogan and Camphill Academy) with a strong link to the Youth Section at the Goetheanum in Switzerland. We parted with a committed group of ten people, a vision of what the conference was going to be about (*Community Building*) and the confirmation that Camphill Newton Dee was willing to host this Youth Conference in May 2023.

The Conference

The program that was built around the theme of "Community Building - How can we (re-)imagine our future", stood on three pillars: (1) Intellectual content - thinking, (2) Newton Dee experience - feeling, and (3) free spaces to connect, share, and create with each other - willing.

The intellectual content was brought in three talks. The first one was called "Why are you here?" presented by Marie Dionie [Em] Palaleo. This talk was about the results of a research conducted to look into the experience of short-term co-workers in Camphill Communities around the world. The said research was led by Dan Mckanan in collaboration with the Camphill Academy and Camphill Foundation, USA. Em used the theme of her talk to open the space for people to reflect on why they were in their respective communities and at the conference. She presented a beautiful insight on experiences young people have when coming to Camphill.

The second talk was about sustainability in intentional communities. This was presented by Martin Sturm and Juan Sebastian Giraldo Armilla. They spoke about what sustainability means on a four-fold approach and their personal experiences with it. These included projects in Newton Dee (Juan) and the Camphill communities in Northern Ireland (Martin). Together they opened up the narrow thinking of sustainability as a purely ecological topic to the social, economic and cultural realm.

The third talk was about personal development and leadership in the light of social three-folding. Jonas Hellbrandt gave a short introduction on Rudolf Steiner's Social Law and how to relate it to personal growth, self-reflection and development of good leadership.

A presentation was given by Katia Popoff and Martin Schwarz about the Discovering Camphill Course which they developed together with a colleague in Camphill Community Glencraig.

Every talk was followed by group activities in which participants had time to reflect on what they heard, while doing something creative or contemplative. The participants remained in the same group to allow a deeper connection with each other. The groups included circus, singing and music, wood carving, meditation, and eurythmy.

Generous lunch breaks and bonfires gave further spaces to connect and form relationships.

Not everyone was from Camphill or an intentional community which gave the conference a great feel of diversity. There was a space called the 'Idea Bazaar' where people shared about exciting projects and new initiatives. Some of the presentations given were from L'Arche, the Youth Section at the Goetheanum and in the UK, Casa De Santa Isabel in Portugal, Freunde Waldorf, the Future Shapers, different Camphill Communities like Camphill Botswana, a project in Banchory, a teaser to 'Born That Way' - an upcoming film about Patrick Lydon and many more from different regional networks and communities around the world.

Newton Dee proved to be a welcoming and generous host. Not only did the 70 participants from all over the world enjoy delicious catering from the Café, but everyone got an invitation to join one of the house communities for a meal. The workshops opened their doors to us for one afternoon and together we celebrated the spirit of community with an inclusive, joyful Ceilidh.

The final morning on Sunday was all about reflection. We created small spaces for inner work, trying to make a start at processing the experiences shared over the long weekend. A group joined Newton Dee's Offering Service before we reconvened in the big circle and said our goodbyes and farewells. Finishing with a powerful Eurythmy "Hallelujah", led by Munja Missalek.
