Ruprecht Fried was a high school teacher of natural scientific subjects at the Waldorf School Uhlandshöhe for many years. Lecturer at the Free University of Stuttgart, Seminar for Waldorf Education.

Constanza Kaliks, Dr. phil., Mathematician, and Educator, earned her doctorate on Nicholas of Cues. She is a member of the Board of the General Anthroposophical Society and, together with her colleagues, leads the Pedagogical and General Anthroposophical Section at the Goetheanum.

He teaches medical anthropology and ethics at the University of Witten/Herdecke and the Alanus University of Art and Social Sciences in Alfter.

Elsbeth Weymann studied German, History, Philosophy, Ancient Greek, and Hebrew at the Universities of Freiburg, Munich, and Athens. For 25 years, she was a high school teacher at Waldorf schools in Munich and Stuttgart. She has lectured in Ancient Greek at the Priest Seminaries in Stuttgart and Hamburg, as well as in methodology and didactics in Waldorf teacher training in Germany and the Baltic States.

Mathias Zaeslin is a teacher of visual arts and music in Langenthal, Switzerland, where he teaches classes 1 to 9 at the Rudolf Steiner School. He is Brazilian, 42 years old, and a father of four children. After completing his degree in Fine Arts at the Faculdade Paulista de Artes in São Paulo, he gained 20 years of experience teaching art at Waldorf schools and in teacher training. He also teaches at the Rudolf Steiner College in São Paulo, where he specializes in art education for Waldorf schools. His artistic research in the fields of visual arts and music is ongoing, and he is particularly inspired by the intensive exchange facilitated by the school environment.

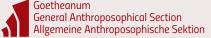

The conference "Rudolf Steiner as Student and Teacher" aims, in the 100th year since his death, to offer another approach to him and his work – from the perspective of lifelong learning. Rudolf Steiner not only taught in a variety of contexts and professional groups, both exoterically and esoterically, but remained, until the end of his life, a constantly reading, studying, and learning person who followed new developments in science, literature, art and religion with the highest attention – but also revisited older writers. Even at his sickbed (October 1924 to March 1925), his secretary, Guenther Wachsmuth, regularly brought many books from Basel. "Whenever I came with a large stack of selected books to his sickbed, it was always an exciting moment when he carefully took the books, looked at the title and author, flipped through some pages, and made his selection."

The conference will focus on selected moments of Rudolf Steiner's life as a learner and teacher — and will continue with further events until the end of 2025 ("Rudolf Steiner reads Schelling"; "Rudolf Steiner reads Thomas Aquinas"; "Rudolf Steiner reads Nicolaus of Cues"). The gathering will culminate on September 28, Michaelmas Eve, with Rudolf Steiner's "Last Address," which will be introduced by a lecture on Raphael and then read. It will conclude with the Michael Imagination in Eurythmy. "In the dawn of the Michael Age," Rudolf Steiner's entire work was carried out.
