



## Membership as cooperative member of iARTe

Cooperative membership of the iARTe is primarily a spiritual level engagement. It manifests the spiritual connection and expresses willingness to:

- be connected to the Medical Section
- participate in the January meeting of training course directors
- share research questions with colleagues
- help develop Anthroposophic Arts Therapies
- discuss and share organisational and curriculum issues with other schools/colleagues
- engage in discussions to support the accreditation process.

Cooperative membership<sup>1</sup> **does not mean that**

- the training is recognised according to the iARTe criteria. Nor is the training course of a cooperative member recognized by the Medical Section. Recognition of a training comes with ordinary membership of the iARTe after it has successfully completed the accreditation process.

Cooperative membership of the iARTe can be promoted on websites etc. Statements on the training brochure however should under no circumstances imply that its cooperative membership in the iARTe leads to the recognized qualification of Anthroposophic Arts Therapist.

The iARTe will produce a membership confirmation which states that:

The anthroposophic art therapy training (name) has joined the iARTe as a cooperative member.

The head of training agrees with the iARTe guidelines for training to an anthroposophic arts therapist and confirms its interest in collaboration about accreditation. The cooperative membership does not correspond to any qualitative recognition by the iARTe.

The annual **membership fee for cooperative members** is **€70 basic fee plus €5 per student**.
