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The **Anthroposophy Studies on Campus** is aimed at anyone looking for an understanding of Rudolf Steiner's work and how Anthroposophy relates to different fields. The program features lessons focused on the study of Rudolf Steiner's books, thematic weekly seminars, artistic courses, and nature observation classes.

No previous academic background or experience is required to apply for this course, apart from a fair knowledge of the English language.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

This is a yearly program in three- trimesters. Each term is designed around a theme and a particular text. The first term starts every October. Participants can enrol for the entire academic year or attend each term separately.

COURSE COMPONENTS

▪ Morning Lessons

The program aims to introduce students to Rudolf Steiner's work. The daily Morning Lessons focus on book study and open discussions.

▪ Weekly Seminars

Weekly Seminars address topics in different fields, such as education, medicine, art, agriculture, natural sciences, and economics. The list of seminars is available on the Goetheanum Studium website.

▪ Art & Nature Observation

Painting, drawing, sculpting, and Eurythmy classes, as well as the Nature Observation outings, enrich the thought process that takes place in the classroom.









▪ Class Trips

Cultural class trips to Chartres and Weimar help expand students' cultural views and allow them to reflect on a particular topic or subject from different perspectives. The cost of the class trips is not included in the tuition.

▪ Student-led project / activities

By the end of the program, students are expected to develop a research-based project with potential applications. Throughout their studies, they are encouraged to propose initiatives that complement the curriculum: creating study groups, organizing seminars, developing community service projects, or any other activity in which students take ownership of the process.
